## Question of the Week

For Children: What can you do to bring the light of Jesus into the lives of your family, friends, and people you meet? For Youth: How do you feel when Jesus says that YOU are the salt of the earth and that YOU are called to be the light for others?

**For Adults:** What specific efforts do you take to maintain your light? Do you let your light dim? Why?
