For Youth: What do you most want God to help you with?


For Adults: Sometimes we can see Christ with clear eyes, as the disciples did on that mountain. Share about such a time in your own life.

On behalf of Sacred Heart Parish, I want to express gratitude for the generosity of the donors, the many hours of volunteer work, and the parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart for helping to bring the *2016 Crab Feed* to a reality. As the auction items have been given, the expenses have been paid, the parish made **\$5800**.

Sacred Heat Crab Feed has been a parish tradition for the past twenty-five years. From the past *Crab Feeds*, the parish has used the proceeds to fund parish ministries, pay parish operating expenses, and fund the faith formation of adults and children.

This recent *Crab Feed* was met with extraordinary challenges. Toxins made the search for available crab difficult and the price higher than planned. Our prime rib chef was unable to be of assistance this year; the decision to keep crab as the main course limited the number of attendees. Most critical: principle volunteers were unavailable (serious health concerns). The primary work of coordinating and executing the *Crab Feed* became the work of parish secretary and bookkeeper, Angie Scott. Though Angie supports the efforts of all parish functions, it is not within her area of responsibility to run the crab feed. Her responsibilities as a parish secretary and bookkeeper are full time, and do not allow her to devote work time for fund raising, an ordinary responsibility of an organization or booster club.

I have made the decision that this past *Crab Feed* for Sacred Heart Parish will be the last parish *Crab Feed*. **The parish will no longer sponsor a Crab Feed.** This was not an easy decision to make, though it was a necessary one. There will be other fund raising activities in this parish and the parish will continue to thrive because of the able individuals to serve the people of God through volunteerism. ---Respectfully, Fr.
