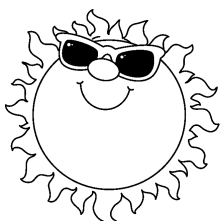

THE IMPORTANCE AND DIGNITY OF THE
SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and a woman establish a lifelong partnership between themselves, derives its force and strength from creation, but for the Christian faithful it is also raised up to a higher dignity, since it is numbered among the Sacraments of the new covenant.

A Marriage is established by the conjugal covenant, that is, the irrevocable consent of both spouses, by which they freely give themselves to each other and accept each other. Moreover, this singular union of a man and a woman requires, and the good of the children demands, the complete fidelity of the spouses and the indissoluble unity of the bond.

The Church defends this understanding, and defines it in this way. Though governments are choosing to redefine civil relationships between two persons as *marriage*, the Catholic Church will now acknowledge the sacramental relationship between one woman and one man as *Holy Matrimony*, beginning December 8, 2016. The way in which the Church prays during this sacrament will expand the prayerful understanding of this sacred covenant. The Church is enriched by her teaching. God bless all who live this sacrament, and inspire others to this sacred covenant.

On Sunday, *June 19th (Father's Day)*, at the *10am Mass*, we will celebrate the Renewal of Wedding Vows and Blessing of Married Couples for any couple who has celebrated the Sacrament of Matrimony in the Catholic Church.
