

WEEKLY REFLECTIONS

Question of the Week

For Children: This week, how can you welcome someone at school or in your neighborhood who is feeling left out?
For Youth: Jesus was able to see the faith of the woman, even though she was a sinner. Who is in need of your forgiveness, even though they have done you harm? What is one way that you can offer forgiveness to someone in the weeks to come?
For Adults: How can you show compassion toward the marginalized members of society today?

Liturgy of the Word

Our first reading and Gospel today focus on forgiveness. Indeed, God is capable of forgiving any sin, whether it be that of the sinful woman who anointed Jesus' feet, or that of King David who had Uriah killed. Pope Francis has identified himself as a sinner; each of us is as well. As we hear these readings, perhaps we can reflect on our own sins in the light of God's grace, and resolve to go to God with contrition in our hearts, that we too may be forgiven.
