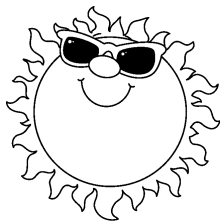

Question of the Week

**For Children:** Jesus tells us to love today. Name a time when you showed your love for your family or friends during the past week or two.
